

# FREE E-BOOK RESOURCES

There are two ways to access e-books

1. **MOST POPULAR:** Downloading books onto an app on your phone, tablet or computer. Common apps include Apple Books, Kindle Cloud Reader, Google Books, Nook Reading App
2. *OR* Reading online through your web connection.



**Free Kindle reading app can be downloaded on any device, including a laptop or PC.** If you have an **Amazon** account you will have access to many free books through the Amazon website that can be put on your Kindle app. **If you have Amazon Prime**, you will have an even bigger selection.

Sign up for the newsletter which alerts you to free e-book offers for **Kindle and Nook**. **The selection varies each day, but once you "buy" the free book, it is yours!** *Kindle users: Remember to click the button that says "Buy now with 1-Click" on the Amazon page! The one that says "Read for Free" is for Kindle Unlimited, a service that requires paid registration.*
